Coming in August: Library Furlough

Due to severe budget cuts, the Maplewood Libraries will be closed for furloughs during several weeks in August. Due dates on library materials will be adjusted accordingly. We will be asking patrons to hold on to borrowed items until after the furlough is over.

You will not be charged overdue fines for the time the libraries are closed. (*Other* outstanding fines will still be owed.)

During the entire furlough period we will not be processing holds or interlibrary loans. You will, however, still be able to access your account through our website.
